KeTLOD “KNOWLEDGE TRANSFER AND LEADERSHIP IN ORGAN DONATION, FROM EUROPE TO CHINA”

EU-CHINA KeTLOD project was launched - January

The Erasmus+ project KeTLOD - “Knowledge transfer and leadership in Organ Donation, from Europe to China” was launched in January 2017. This project co-funded by the European Commission coordinated by the University of Barcelona gathers 3 Universities from Spain, France and Italy alongside 7 Universities from China. The aim of KeTLOD is to implement a postgraduate programme in organ donation in China, for healthcare professionals.



Training for trainers course completed – May

From 22nd of May till 25th of May, 2017 was held the “Training for trainers” face to face course of KeTLOD project in Barcelona. The aim of this course is to provide healthcare professionals from the 7 Chinese Universities involved with the knowledge, competences and skills required to become faculty in the upcoming Postgraduate Programme in Organ Donation.

During their stay in Barcelona, the future trainers reinforced the knowledge acquired during the online course, through a “learn-by-doing” methodology including active workshops and active team building exercises. They also had the opportunity to meet with experts in education and experts in organ donation from DTI foundation, University of Barcelona, University of Bologna and University of Nice, who led the training as course faculty.

Midterm Meeting – May

Following the completion of the Training for Trainers face-to-face course, KeTLOD project mid-term meeting was held in Barcelona on May 26th, 2017. Representatives from the KeTLOD Consortium gathered at the Scientific Park of Barcelona to review the project implementation, progress accomplished and future steps.

In addition to the project Consortium, invited authorities from the University of Barcelona, the Catalan Transplant Organization (OCATT), the General Consulate of China in Barcelona and the Scientific Park of Barcelona also joined the meeting and shared their support to the project.



Start of the Postgraduate Programme in Organ Donation

The postgraduate programme in organ donation is launched in 7 Chinese universities partners of KeTLOD project for 144 selected participants among healthcare professionals from across China.

This is the First postgraduate diploma in organ donation accredited by the high education institutions in China and recognized from the European High Education in Europe, corresponding to 625 study hours or 25 ECTS.

The postgraduate programme will include a blended (online and face-to-face methodology), involving: Organ donation online modules, local seminars, cross-curricular groups projects, hospital traineeships and an international face-to-face seminar.
